Promoting Diversity and Excellence in Union Leadership and Labor Studies

For students seeking an M.A. in Labor Studies or a B.A. in Urban and Community Studies, with a concentration in Labor

Mission and Goals

Over the past 50 years, demographics of the U.S. labor force have changed significantly, with dramatic increases in the number of women and people of color. The racial and gender composition of national union leadership, however, does not adequately reflect these changing demographics. The field of Labor Studies reflects a similar imbalance in representation.

The Joseph S. Murphy Scholarship for Diversity in Labor program for excellence and diversity in labor is dedicated to the purpose of fostering new and diverse leadership in the labor movement and in the academic discipline of Labor Studies. In supporting students committed to diversity and excellence, the scholarship program seeks to make a significant contribution toward redressing existing imbalances in these fields.

Scholarship Awards

Awardees will receive:

- Up to \$30,000 awarded over two years for graduate study
- Up to \$20,000 awarded over two years for undergraduate study

Students are encouraged to enroll such that their course of study will be completed within the two-year funding period of the award. Awards are offered in the fall semester of each academic year and are renewable, contingent on maintenance of good academic standing. Transcripts and Financial Aid information will be reviewed and enrollment will be verified to ensure the recipients continue to meet scholarship eligibility requirements. Award amounts may vary from semester to semester depending on the recipients' enrollment status.

Terms and Conditions of the Scholarship

Scholarship awards will be based on a national competition and are designed to create pipelines that will bring women and people of color to the forefront of the labor movement. Specifically, the Joseph S. Murphy Scholarship for Diversity in Labor is dedicated to the purpose of fostering new, diverse, and representative leadership in the labor movement and in the academic discipline of Labor Studies. To that end, applicants must be part of an underrepresented minority in the field of labor who have demonstrated a commitment to increase the participation of women and people of color in the field of labor.

Deadline Date for Filing the Scholarship Application

The deadline date for submission of the scholarship application is **March 19, 2019**.

<u>Deadline Date for submitting the MA in Labor Studies or the BA in Urban and Community Studies</u> <u>Admissions Application</u>

In order to be eligible for a 2019 Joseph S. Murphy Scholarship for Diversity in Labor, new applicants for admission to either the MA in Labor Studies or the BA in Urban and Community Studies must have their complete admissions application submitted no later than February 19, 2019. In order to be considered for admissions, accompanying required letters of recommendation must be received no later than February 19, 2019 at 11:59 pm.

Scholarships and College Financial Aid

If awarded a scholarship, applicants must complete a 2019-2020 <u>FAFSA</u> form to determine the impact this scholarship opportunity may have on any other financial aid they may be applying for or receiving. Additional guidance for completing the FAFSA form will be provided to awardees by the CUNY SLU Financial Aid office.

Award Notification and Application

Awardees will be notified no later than April 15, 2019. All awards are for the 2019-2020 academic year and the first term award will be applied to each recipient's incumbent balance in September 2019.

Eligibility Requirements

Undergraduate Applicants

Those applying for the undergraduate scholarship must have either 1) completed 60 college credits at an accredited institution and be interested in transferring into the CUNY School of Labor and Urban Studies B.A. program in Urban and Community Studies with a concentration in Labor or 2) currently enrolled in the CUNY School of Labor and Urban Studies B.A. program in Urban and Community Studies with a concentration in Labor and have accumulated a minimum of 60 credits at the time the application is submitted. In either case, the student will be expected to use the scholarship award to help them complete the program. You must be accepted into or currently enrolled in the BA in Urban and Community Studies degree program in order to be eligible for this award.

- Must have completed a minimum of 60 college credits
- First-time applicants must have a minimum 2.5 Grade Point Average (GPA) from prior undergraduate work
- Currently enrolled students must have a minimum 2.5 Grade Point Average (GPA)
- Demonstrated potential for leadership in social justice movements and/or capacity for academic scholarship in the field of Labor Studies
- Two letters of recommendation from either academics and/or practitioners in areas of social justice, labor, or labor education
- A compelling statement of purpose as defined under the Terms and Conditions of the Scholarship Application Requirements and Submission Process
- Strong writing proficiency as demonstrated through a required 500-word writing sample, to be sent as an attachment with your application to scholarships@slu.cuny.edu
- First-time applicants must complete the online <u>undergraduate application for admission</u> to the BA in Urban and Community Studies by February 19, 2019

Graduate Applicants

Those applying for the graduate scholarship must be entering students in the Murphy Institute's M.A. in Labor Studies degree program. You must be accepted into the MA in Labor Studies degree program in order to be eligible for this award.

- Must have a minimum 3.0 Grade Point Average (GPA) from prior undergraduate work
- Demonstrated potential for leadership in social justice movements and/or capacity for academic scholarship in the field of Labor Studies
- Two letters of recommendations from either academics and/or practitioners in areas of social justice, labor, or labor education
- A compelling statement of purpose as defined under the Terms and Conditions of the Scholarship Application Requirements and Submission Process
- Strong writing proficiency as demonstrated through a required 1,000 writing sample, to be sent as an attachment with your scholarship application to scholarships@slu.cuny.edu
- Complete the online graduate application for admission to the MA in Labor Studies by February 19, 2019.

Scholarship Application Requirements & Submission Process

All applicants must also complete and submit the scholarship application found below. In addition to a completed application, all scholarship applicants are required to submit:

- A single-spaced, 500 1,000-word personal statement, describing:
 - Your interest and/or experience in labor or other social justice movements and/or the field of Labor Studies, including any college, community or union activities
 - Any honors or awards you have received
 - Your career objective
 - Why you are a good candidate for the Joseph S. Murphy Scholarship for Diversity in Labor
- A writing sample (1,000 or more words for graduate applicants, 500 or more words for undergraduate applicants). The writing sample may include something that you have written preciously for another purpose (work, union, school) or for example a personal story that will tell us more about why you are interested in continuing your education. Ultimately, please share with us a writing sample that you believe will reflect your best writing.
- Two letters of recommendation from academics and/or practitioners in social justice movements, unions, or labor education in which they discuss 1) why they believe you are an excellent candidate for the Diversity Scholarship; 2) what social justice or labor activities you have undertaken; and 3) your potential for leadership in these areas or in the academic field of Labor Studies
- If requested, applicants must be available for a Skype or in-person interview.
