Program Overview

The Certificate in Labor Relations examines the opportunities and challenges facing working people and their organizations. The program will strengthen the ability of students to become more effective advocates and practitioners for social justice and workers' rights. Students develop critical thinking, and analytical and leadership skills, while building practical knowledge in the field of labor relations, including labor law, collective bargaining, and contract administration.
