#### The CUNY School of Labor and Urban Studies...

- Is the newest CUNY School, founded in 2018
- Focuses on social justice through urban and labor studies
- Dedicates itself to the mission of educational access, diversity at every level, and equality for all

#### The Collegiate Science and Technology Entry Program...

- Abbreviates to CSTEP!
- Is funded by New York State grants to colleges and universities
- Focuses on increasing access to STEM and professional education for minority and underserved students

### What is Project LAW?

CSTEP Project L.A.W. is a gateway program for minority and underserved students to enter law school.

#### It includes:

- 10-week **fully online** learning experience
- Expert faculty instruction on labor law through a social justice lens
- Test preparation for the LSAT
- Law School application workshops
- Customized weekly instruction in legal writing

## Are you Eligible for Project LAW? (1)

#### All applicants must:

- 1. Be New York State residents for at least 12 months
- 2. Demonstrate an interested in labor law and social justice

#### They must also be:

African-American, Hispanic/Latino, American Indian, or Alaskan
 Native

#### OR

Economically disadvantaged per the <u>New York State Education</u>
 <u>Department income criteria</u>

## Are you Eligible for Project LAW? (2)

**In addition**, applicants must have current or previous enrollment in an undergraduate or graduate college program as follows:

#### **Undergraduate Students**

- Class Standing: 60 to 120 earned credits
- GPA: 3.0

#### **Graduate Students**

- Class Standing: max earned graduate credits is less than 12
- GPA: 3.0

## Program Benefits!

Upon successful completion of the Project LAW program, students will receive:

- A Credly<sup>©</sup> digital badge that can be linked to your social media accounts, graduate applications, & more!
- A monetary stipend or technology assistance (upon completion of the program and required documentation)

Note: Program activities are subject to changes due to available funding

## Successful Completion?

#### **Successful Completion** of the program is defined as:

- No more than two (2) absences throughout the duration of the 10-week program
- No more than two (2) missed CSTEP Project L.A.W. assignments throughout the duration of the 10-week program
- Active engagement and participation with professors, fellow participants, and guest speakers

**Note**: Professors have the ultimate discretion on what is deemed "successful completion" of the CSTEP Project LAW program and will consider situations on a case-by-case basis

### Project LAW Courses

#### **CSTEP Law Course (1.5 hr)**

Analyze real labor court cases to learn key legal concepts

#### LSAT Preparation (1.5 hr)

Get familiar with the LSAT format and key test-taking skills

3 Hours per Week

**8 Weeks** of Instruction

**2 Weeks** of Guest Speakers

## How Does It Work?

### Weekly or Bi-Weekly

- Project LAW courses (in Summer 2023) run either <u>5:30 PM to</u> <u>7:00 PM on Wednesdays</u> or <u>11:00 AM to 12:30 AM on</u> <u>Thursdays</u>
- **LSAT Prep** courses (in Summer 2023) run either <u>5:30 PM to</u> <u>7:00 PM on Fridays or 9:00 AM to 10:30 AM on Thursdays</u>

Students can choose to attend a 3-hour course once a week, or a 1.5-hour course twice a week, dependent on their schedule.

Supplemental Writing Instruction will be available on Mondays and Tuesdays
